Introduction

Dear Parents


The THUMB Coloring Book is designed to introduce your kids to children living in different cultures around the world. The boys and girls your kids will color represent people groups whom God loves, but who have little or no access to the life-changing gospel message. The full coloring book offers simple descriptions of each group's religious beliefs and examples of how to pray for these people to know and follow Jesus.

Terms to Know

- **People group** individuals, families, and clans who share a common language, culture, and belief system.
- **Unreached or least reached** people groups who have no opportunity to hear about Jesus. They don't have a Bible, access to Christian media, contact with believers in Jesus, or a culturally relevant church.
- THUMB an acronym for five major non-Christian worldviews prevalent in unreached cultures. "T" is for "Tribal," "H" is for "Hindu," "U" is for "Unreligious" or atheist, "M" is for "Muslim," and "B" is for "Buddhist." These five worldviews exist alongside Christianity in many cultures around the world.

Hmong (mung) of LAOS









To the Hmong, songs are a sign of happiness. They love singing when they are hunting and doing chores.

Long ago the Rajputs were nobles. Today the Rajputs are well respected throughout India.




In the summer, kids in Japan like to swim and play sports like sumo wrestling, karate, baseball and golf. A sumo wrestling tournament in Japan is an important event!

Patna (paht-nah) of INDIA






The Patna enjoy going to live dances and performances with colorful costumes and loud music.
